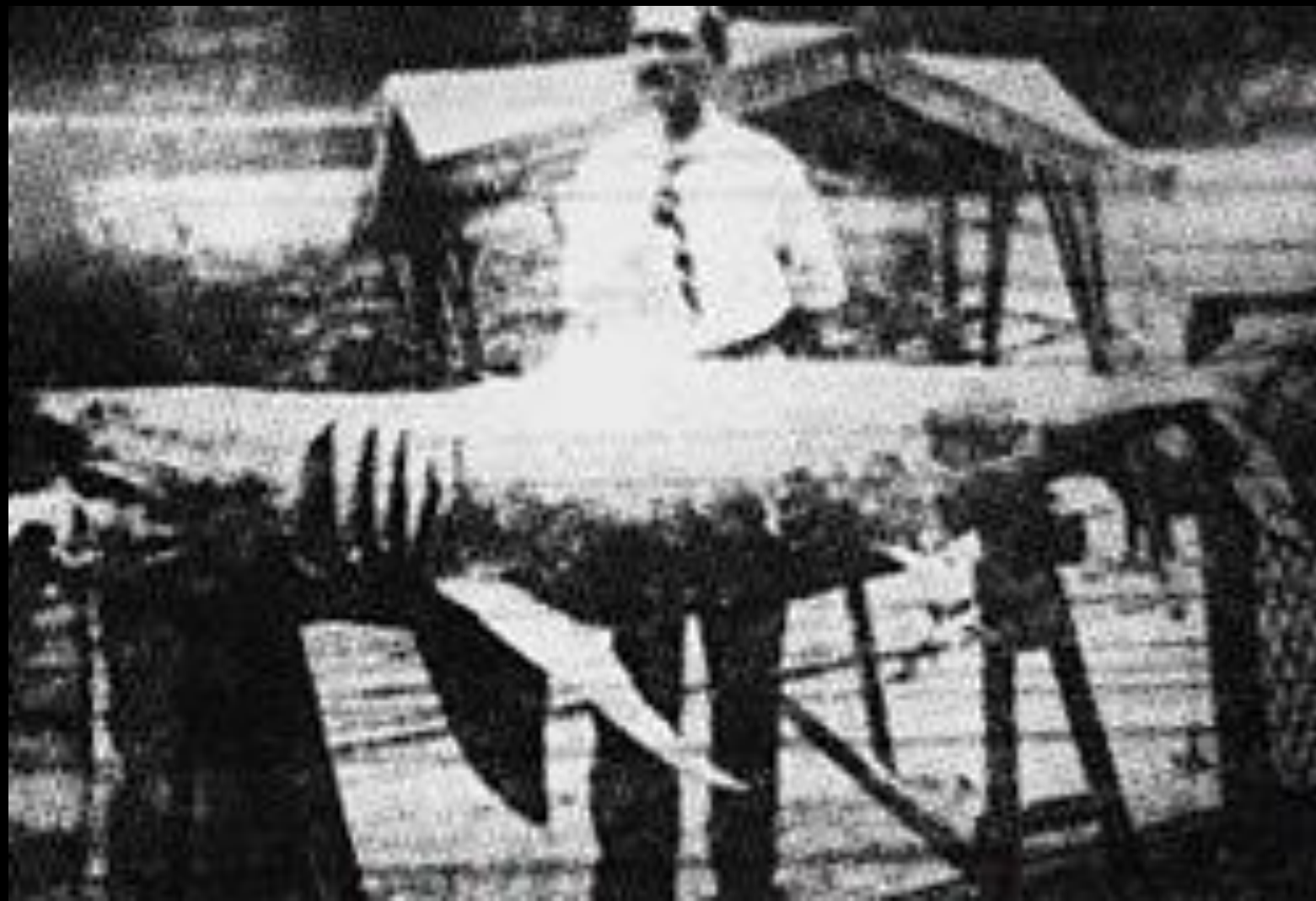

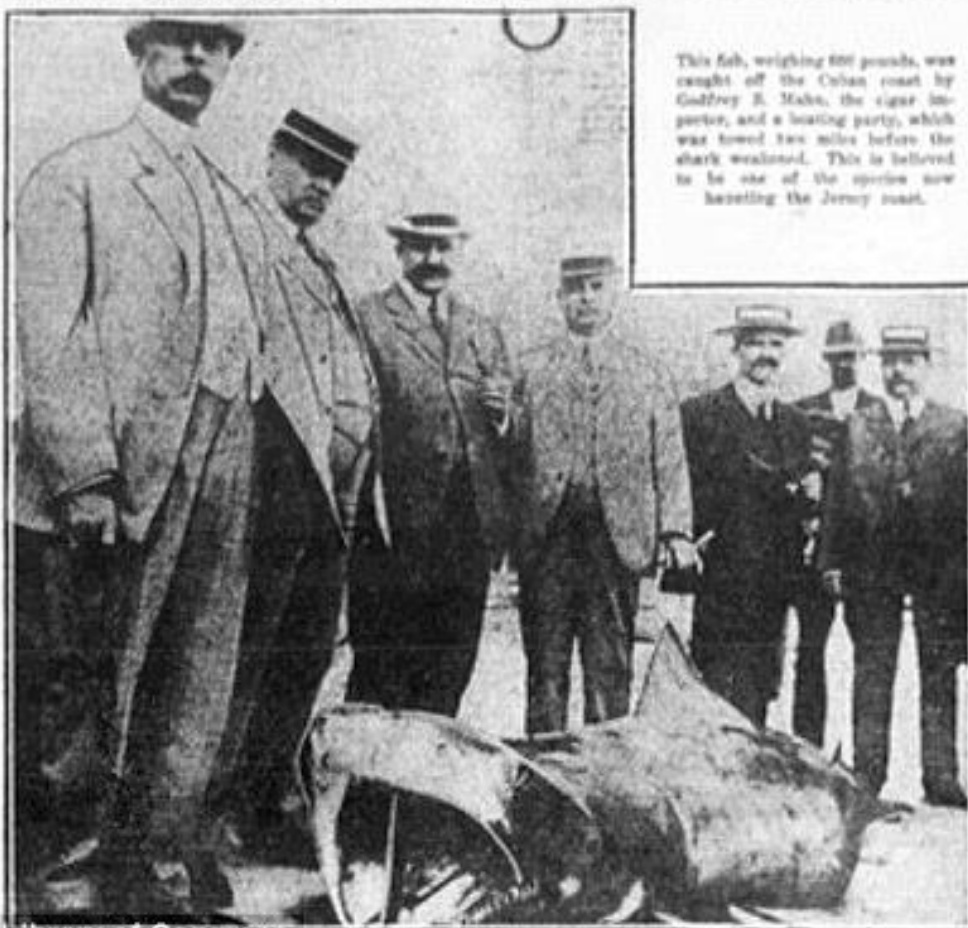

### FOSTER RETIRED FROM U. S. PRESIDENCY

SCRANTON, Pa., July 7.—Thomas J. Foster, founder of International Correspondence Schools, failed of reelection as president when the board of directors met for reorganization today. W. W. Wren, ex-president of the Scranton Board of Trade and a business man, was made president. He was appointed vice president when local banks went to the rescue of the schools, some time ago. Mr. Foster is to continue in the capacity of the schools, but chairman of the directors.

### VILLA RECRUITING AGENTS AT WORK NEAR PERU

COLUMBUS, N. M., July 7.—Villa agents are recruiting men south of the American expedition's advanced base, according to reports brought here today. 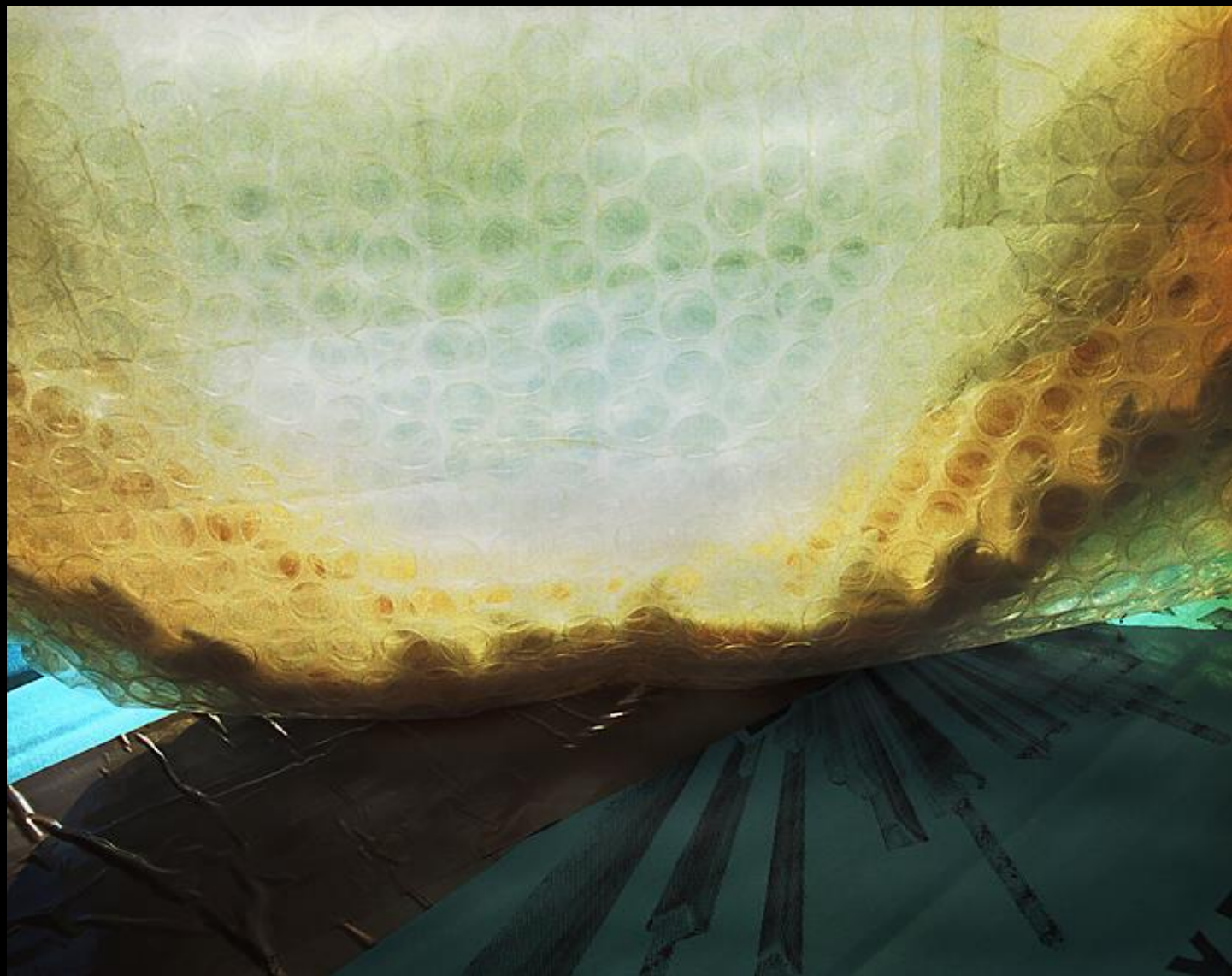

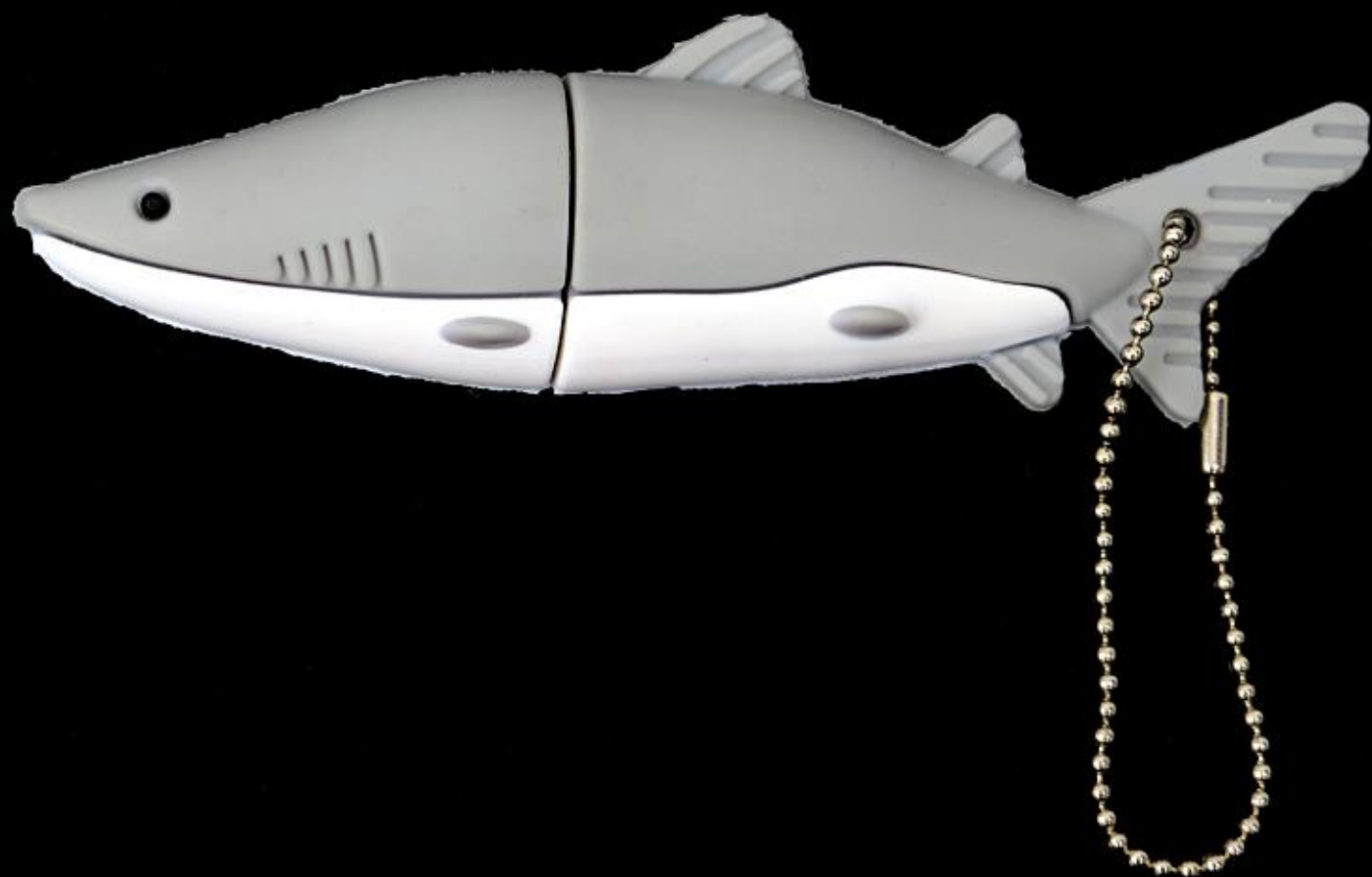


















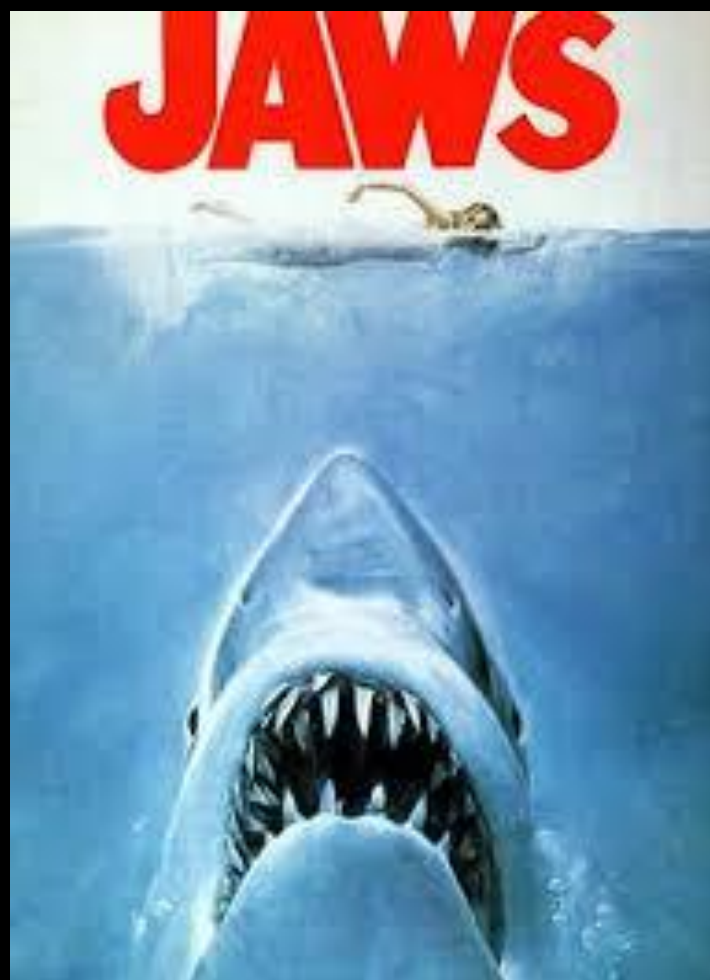
