1. BASES-FEPSAC 2017 conference: FEPSAC poster awards for young researcher

For next year's BASES–FEPSAC conference, which takes place in Nottingham, UK (28–29 November 2017), FEPSAC would like to encourage students of any age, gender and nationality to apply for the Elsevier Poster Award. The best three poster presentations will be awarded prizes of €500, €300 and €200 for the first, second and third respectively.

The award criteria will be as follows:

- The applicant must be the presenting, and thus first author signing the abstract
- The applicant must be a student, with a FEPSAC membership in 2107
- The abstract must be the only one submitted by a given applicant for that award
- The abstract must not be entered for any other FEPSAC or BASES Conference award
- The awards will be given for excellence, reflected in the academic content, presentation and defense quality of the poster presentation
- The award panel may choose to shortlist presentations for this award based on the scientific merit of the abstracts
- The award panel's decision will be final in all instances
