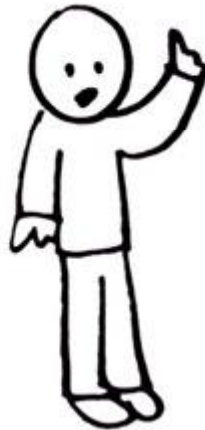

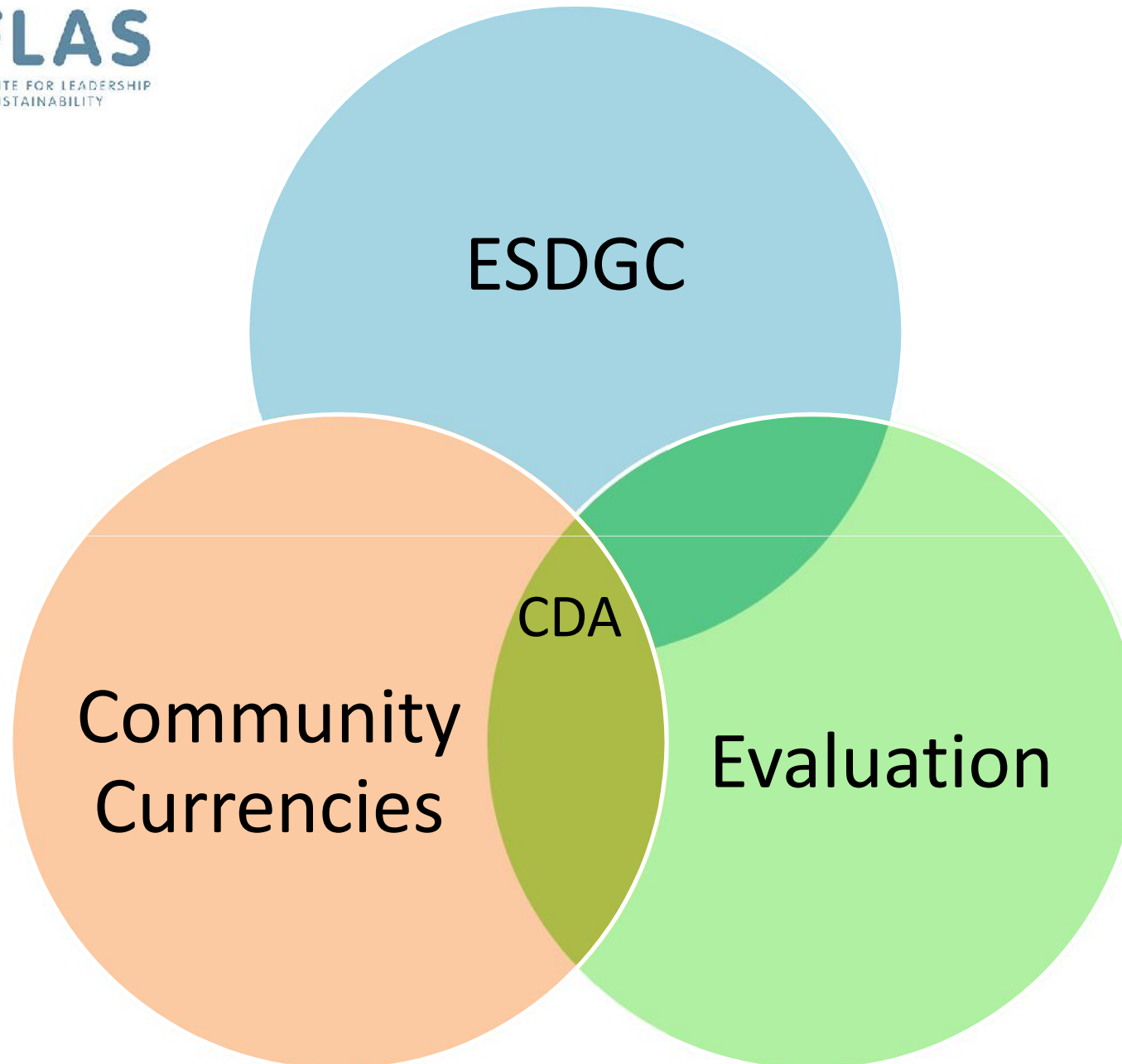

- Implications of discourse for: teaching, evaluation, ESDGC



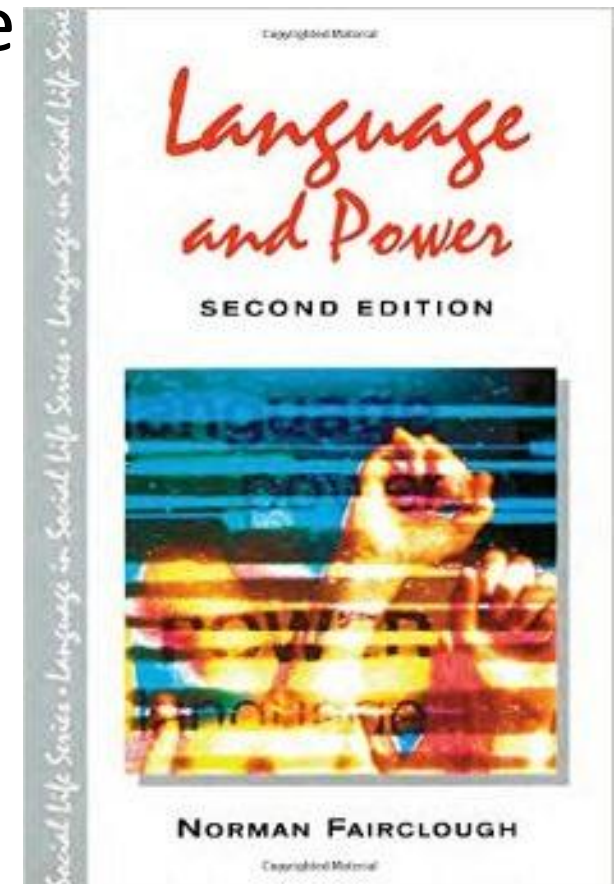
