

MACRO-ECONOMIC OVERVIEW

Trends in the economy during quarter 2 of 2021 have led to increased optimism about emerging from the Covid crisis. Economic forecasts for 2021 published by the UK Treasury have been revised upwards from +5.7% GDP growth anticipated back in April to +6.8% in September. Estimates of average LFS unemployment for 2021 are also less pessimistic - revised downwards from 6.2% to 5.2%. These altered expectations no doubt reflect an increase in confidence amongst policymakers about the beneficial impacts of the vaccine programme. Data for the second quarter (April-June) shows GDP growth on the previous quarter of +4.8%. Figure 1 shows however that GDP has still not returned to pre-pandemic levels.

Figure 1: UK GDP is estimated to have grown by 0.1% in July 2021, and remains 2.1% below its pre-pandemic level (February 2020)

Monthly index, January 2007 to July 2021, 2018 = 100





The labour market also shows signs of recovery – the number of employees on payroll increased to 29.1m in July 2021 returning to levels recorded prior to the pandemic in February 2020 (employees on furlough are included in this calculation). The employment rate dropped to 74.7% in quarter 1 but has recovered to 75.2% in the 3 months to July 2021. There has also been a continuing downward trend in LFS unemployment which fell from 4.8% in quarter 1 to 4.6% in the second quarter.

These positive signs, however, are also accompanied by challenging circumstances for many businesses. In particular, labour markets have been severely disrupted since March 2020 mainly due to the pandemic but also the effects of Brexit on the flow of EU migrant labour to the UK. Policy responses to the pandemic have meant that the normal workings of the labour market have been partially suspended and there are now major adjustments taking place in the system as market mechanisms return to something resembling normality. One consequence of this is the record level of vacancies waiting to be filled as businesses in different sectors all seek workers to resume operations simultaneously. The number of job vacancies in June to September 2021 reached a staggering 1,034,000, a level not seen since records began in 2002. The largest increases were recorded in sectors that are very prominent in Cumbria, - in particular, the numbers of vacancies reported nationally in the period June to August 2021 was 75% higher than the previous three months in accommodation & food service activities (ONS Labour Market Overview UK: September 2021).

CORPORATE CHANGE IN CUMBRIA: APRIL - JUNE 2021

The second quarter of 2021 has seen considerable levels of reported investment either undertaken or presently underway in the County. As noted at national level using job vacancy data, the resurgence has been particularly notable in the Accommodation and Food sector, although there have also been significant developments in Retailing and the Arts, Entertainment and Recreation sector (see Summary Table 2 and Table 3). Being people-centred, these sectors were of course, the hardest hit by the series of lockdowns and trading restrictions that the UK economy has suffered since the Covid-pandemic began. Whilst there have been some permanent closures and resultant loss of jobs in bars (The Circle Bar, Carlisle) and cafés (see The Silecroft Beach café), many accommodation providers have used their time (and/or coronavirus business support grants) in the lockdowns to invest in their premises (see The Swan Hotel; The Holiday Inn Express; The Melbreak Country House Hotel; The Commodore; The Red Lion; Quiet Site; The Duke of Cumberland; Parkdean Resorts; Lakes Hotel & Spa; and The Wild Strawberry). During April and May, they have been able to re-open with newly refurbished interiors, extensions, balconies and outdoor socialising spaces. As a result, the Accommodation and Food Services sector has seen a total of approximately 125 reported job gains. This sector and parts of the Arts, Entertainment and Recreation sector (see Rydal Mount; The Ravenglass & Eskdale Railway Co.; The Rocket Theatre group; and Cumbrian Cow Maize Maze) have "geared up" for the "staycation" boom.

The Covid pandemic has undoubtedly had a part to play in the rise of on-line food ordering (see Uber Eats; A Day's Walk; The takeawaysite.com; Dine in the Lakes; Mc Donalds; and Deliveroo) and the provision of take-away snacks and meals (see Bruce and Luke's, Keswick; The Melbreak Country House Hotel, Workington; Yummies, Maryport; and Laing's Café, Harker). Changing consumer trends have also been seen to have positive effects in the Retail sector with new eco-shops opening or making further investments (see Cut the Wrap, Ulverston; Ria-Plenish, Refill and Eco Shop, Brampton; Re:Plenish, Carlisle; and Eco Tree, Carlisle).

In Manufacturing, in the Food & Drink industry, in particular, there have been many reports of firms innovating, launching new products and extending their product range (see St. James' Cheeses; English Lakes Ice cream; Hawkshead Relish and The Lakes Distillery).

As was noted in the last quarter (see CRED Economic Bulletin, vol. 8), there are reports of firms and/or universities collaborating for the purposes of research and development. Createc, Cockermouth, which develops and applies technologies for nuclear decommissioning has won a contract to develop technology for underwater nuclear decommissioning. The firm is working with Fortis Remote Technology, Broughton-in-Furness which specialises in the development of underwater tooling for nuclear and offshore sectors (IC, 1.4.21). The company has also joined forces with Boston Dynamics, a robot company in Massachusetts. They will collaborate to build new application capabilities and commercial opportunities for quadruped robots to operate in hazardous environments, removing the need to put human operators in those situations (IC, 24.6.21). In another example, Inov-8, sports footwear designer and retailer, Staveley, in partnership with the University of Manchester, has designed the world's first running shoe that uses Graphone-enhanced cushion foam, called G-FLY. The latter helps marathon and long-distance runners maintain a faster speed over greater distances and keeps "their feet feeling fresher for longer" (IC, 1.4.21). The University of Cumbria is also leading a £14M business initiative to see Cumbria hit a target of carbon neutrality by 2037. It is part of "a partnership of 6 universities which will support companies with high-level degree students and academics with access to labs, equipment and expertise on a scale never seen before. The aim is to help stimulate growth in a sustainable way, cutting carbon emissions amongst SMEs in the County" (IC, 22.4.21).

Innovation in the provision of new business services has also been apparent (see JB Cumbria; NTC; Mc Daniels Law; Realise; and Cumbrian Chamber of Commerce) as well as the expansion of provision of such services (see PHX Training; Just R; and Mountain Incorporated).

Finally, the Public sector has seen large grants given to Carlisle District Council and Barrow Borough Council. In the case of Carlisle, £400,000 of funding from The Borderlands project will go towards the refurbishment of the historic Turkish Baths. The planned redevelopment of that area of the city should also make the baths more attractive to users. Barrow Borough Council has secured £25M from the Government's Towns Fund allowing it "to develop plans for regeneration of the town under the project collective name of #BrilliantBarrow. Seven projects will be funded that will transform the town to make it an attractive place to live, work and visit. Plans include a Barrow campus for the University of Cumbria, expected to be completed by 2024; a network of community hubs; new cycling and walking infrastructure and housing renewal. An additional investment of £1.1M from Historic England will be used to revitalise Duke Street in the town centre" (IC, 3.4.21). Of course, these investment funds will go to businesses in the private sector as projects proceed.
