



In Carlisle, **Tullie House Museum & Art Gallery** will be exhibiting rare minerals from lesser-known mines in Cumbria. With photographs through time of the mines from **Cumbria Amenity Trust and Mining History Society's Archives**.



Wordsworth Grasmere have daily gallery tours and activities on Wordsworth and geology. At the Jerwood Centre, you will be able to see a special exhibit: **'Wordsworth, Jonathan Otley and the environment'**.



In Whitehaven, use the **Beacon Museum's** digital geology touch screen interactive and powerful telescopes, to find out about the history and development of the town and harbour of Whitehaven.



Visit 19th century mine, **Killhope mining Museum**, near Alston. This multi-award winning museum is giving site tours and made a '**Prospectors Pavillion**' for you to see on your visit.



In Cockermouth, **Wordsworth House and Garden** have an exhibit which challenges us to rethink the basis of our relationship with the fells. **'Scree'** is on until 6th Nov 22.


In Barrow, **the Dock Museum** has permanent exhibits based on the iron ore mines and how Barrow in Furness was built on this geological discovery.
