
## Evolution to the KAR

- 150 troops were posted in from India as a core capability
- British Central African Rifles is formed under command of Captain Maguire and quells the unrest throughout the protectorate
- 1898 a second battalion was formed and the regiment is renamed the Central African Rifles
- 1899 renamed the Central African Regiment and expanded further to serve outside of the Protectorate in West as well as East Africa.
- 1902 British Forces in East and Central Africa were amalgamated to become the Kings African Rifles under Command of Brigadier General William Manning
- The two CAR battalions became the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalions, KAR








1<sup>st</sup> shot near Lome in Togoland 7 Aug 1914

Last shot was at Chambezi near Kasama in Northern Rhodesia 13 Nov 1918 (2 days after the last shot at Mons)

Lettow - Vorbeck signed the surrender on 16 Nov 1918 then marched with his troops 100 miles N to Abercorn where he surrended to Brigadier General Edwards commanding the KAR




